### Türkiye's Exports in 2025 Hit Record High of \$396B: President Erdoğan

Türkiye now Europe's 4th-largest, world's 12th-largest production hub, producing 1.5M vehicles a year, says Recep Tayyip Erdoğan



Exports of goods and services from Türkiye in 2025 reached an all-time high of \$396 billion, President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan said. Türkiye has become Europe's fourth-largest production hub and the world's 12th-largest, producing 1.5 million vehicles a year and exporting over \$41 billion in automobiles, Erdoğan said at an event in Istanbul.

President Erdoğan said that defense and aviation exports are among Türkiye's major sources of pride, noting that the country has become a globally recognized player in this field. He highlighted the recent agreement with Spain as confirmation of Türkiye's leading role, adding that the aircraft's entry into the inventory of a European and NATO member expand opportunities in the coming years.

Türkiye's defense exports have risen fortyfold from \$248 million in 2002 to \$9.87 billion in 2025, he added. Erdoğan stated that Türkiye has become the EU's fifth-largest trading partner, with trade volume reaching \$232.7 billion in 2025 and exports to the EU rising to \$117 billion. He underlined that modernizing the Customs Union with the EU is now unavoidable and expressed hope that the bloc would soon authorize and begin negotiations. He also warned against EU protectionist measures, emphasizing that Türkiye expects respect for the partnership and will take all necessary steps to protect its industries' competitiveness.

In 2025, Türkiye's exports reached \$73.7 billion with Organization of Islamic Cooperation members, \$11 billion with Turkic states, \$5.6 billion with non-EU Balkan countries, and around \$19.2 billion with the US, Canada, and Mexico, he said. "No stopping, we move forward," he added.

### Global Trade to Hit Record High of \$35T Despite Slowing Momentum: UN Agency

UNCTAD expects 7% growth in global trade in 2025, adding \$2.2T, even as geopolitical tensions, higher costs, uneven global demand slowed



The UN reported that global trade is expected to reach an all-time high of \$35 trillion in 2025, despite geopolitical tensions. "The new data confirm that trade continued expanding through the second half of 2025, even as geopolitical tensions, higher costs, and uneven global demand slowed momentum," the UN Trade and Development Organization (UNCTAD) said in a statement.

Global trade is expected to grow 7% in 2025, adding \$2.2 trillion and setting a new record, according to the agency. In the third quarter, global trade grew 2.5% compared to the previous quarter. Growth is expected to continue in the final quarter, though at a slower pace. "If projections hold, goods would

add about \$1.5 trillion to this year's total and services \$750 billion, consistent with an overall 7% annual increase," it noted.

Stating that prices are seeing a significant change, the agency said they are now anticipated to decline, following two quarters where trade values increased in part due to the rising cost of goods. "As a result, the increase in global trade at the end of 2025 comes from higher volumes – the actual quantity of goods shipped – rather than from price increases. This points to stable demand even as inflation eases," it noted.

With a 10% increase in intra-regional trade, East Asia saw the highest export growth over the previous year at 9%. Africa also saw its exports rise 6% and imports increase 10%, while South-South trade increased almost 8%, indicating the strengthening of linkages between developing economies. In terms of individual economies, Brazil and South Africa were major forces in South America and Africa, while China and South Korea were notable in East Asia.

Manufacturing rose 10% during the year, with electronics leading the way at 14% due to demand for artificial intelligence (AI). Cereals and fruit and vegetable exports jumped 11% in the third quarter, indicating a significant expansion in agriculture. Trade in fossil fuels fell due to decreasing costs, and automobile trade dropped 4%.

He said Ankara is working on enhancing "good relations" with Islamabad, and that it will make efforts to expand cooperation in various fields, such as energy, trade, and investment.

The International Peace and Trust Forum in Ashgabat is held to mark the 30th anniversary of Turkmenistan's status of permanent neutrality and the UN General Assembly's designation of 2025 as International Year of Peace and Trust.

## Türkiye's President Erdoğan Meets Malaysian Premier Anwar in Ankara

**President Erdoğan holds talks with Anwar Ibrahim during his three-day official visit to Türkiye, which includes high-level discussions, signing of several agreements**



Türkiye will continue assessing joint steps with Malaysia in the defence industry under a “win-win” framework, said President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, as the two countries seek to broaden cooperation across strategic, economic, and diplomatic fields. Speaking at a joint press conference in Ankara with Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim, Erdoğan said the first high-level cooperation meeting — agreed during his visit to Kuala Lumpur last year— was held earlier in the day, marking a concrete step toward closer bilateral coordination.

Beyond defence and investments in Türkiye, pointing to growing opportunities in defence, infrastructure, and advanced industries, Erdoğan said the talks covered education, culture and people-to-people ties, describing them as pillars for long-term cooperation. “We also consulted on the human dimension that forms the foundation of Türkiye–Malaysia friendship and brotherhood,” Erdoğan said. “We decided to continue our efforts in education, culture, and tourism, as well as to take steps that will strengthen dialogue between our peoples,” he said.

Regional and global issues were also discussed, with both sides sharing similar positions. “Especially, we will continue to closely follow Gaza,” Erdoğan said, underscoring common concern over the conflict. The Turkish president added that Ankara places importance on engagement with regional partners and ASEAN under its Asia Anew Initiative, launched in 2019.

Turkish exports to Malaysia surged 52% year-on-year in the January–October period to \$509.5 million as a result of efforts the two countries carried to boost their commercial relations and focus on developing cooperation in trade and tourism. Türkiye aims to develop cooperation with Malaysia, a country included in its “Faraway Countries Strategy,” in trade, tourism, defense, and investments, among others. The trade volume between Türkiye and Malaysia rose 11.6% on an annual basis in the first 10 months of the year to reach \$4.3 billion, according to data from the country’s statistical office TurkStat. In 2024, trade between the two countries totaled \$4.9 billion.

Following Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan’s visit to Malaysia on Feb. 10-11, Turkish exports to the country started an upward trend. During his visit, some 11 agreements were signed between the two countries, reflecting positively on trade figures. Deals on energy, trade, scientific research, and defense exports to Malaysia came to the fore. Erdoğan and Malaysian Premier Anwar Ibrahim decided to increase the bilateral trade volume target from \$5 billion to \$10 billion at a joint press conference.

Erdoğan said technology transfer and joint production projects created a momentum in the Turkish defense industry, and that this would continue with firms ready to share their know-how and products with Malaysia to benefit both countries. Meanwhile, the number of tourists arriving from Malaysia to Türkiye rose 11% year-on-year in October, reaching 82,315, according to data from the Turkish Culture and Tourism Ministry.

## Türkiye and Hungary Sign Security, Culture Deals to Deepen Strategic Partnership

Turkish President Erdoğan says that Ankara and Budapest are close to reaching \$6 billion trade volume target at a joint news conference in Istanbul.



Türkiye and Hungary have signed agreements on many fields, including aviation, security, technology, culture, and education, to enhance bilateral ties, the Turkish president said. Speaking at a joint news conference with Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orbán in Istanbul, Recep Tayyip Erdoğan said the two countries are close to reaching \$6-billion trade volume target.

"We implemented 28 joint actions, allocated resources to joint projects" in 2025, which was declared Türkiye-Hungary Year of Science and Innovation, Erdoğan added. Orbán also hailed Türkiye's regional role and Erdoğan's diplomatic efforts, saying the Turkic world is emerging as a dynamic and strengthening force. He said Erdoğan had told him that a different world is coming and the Turkic world will gather great energy, and that he observed a grand vision behind the concept of "Turkish century." The Hungarian premier also appreciated Türkiye's efforts to end the Russia-Ukraine war, describing Erdoğan as "the only successful mediator" in the process.

Orban has paid a visit to Türkiye to attend the 7th Meeting of the Türkiye-Hungary High-Level Strategic Cooperation Council.

## Türkiye's Trade Minister Says Talks in US 'Strengthened' Path Toward \$100B Trade Goal

Ankara 'will steadfastly pursue its vision of a long-term, predictable, and mutually beneficial economic partnership' with US, says Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat



Türkiye's Trade Minister Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat said that Ankara and the US have made progress toward expanding bilateral commerce. "Türkiye will steadfastly pursue its vision of a long-term, predictable, and mutually beneficial economic partnership with the United States," Bolat said.

Following the meeting with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and the business community, "During our discussions, we explained to the business community Türkiye's steady economic growth, which has continued for 21 consecutive quarters, and its potential," Bolat said. Stressing that Ankara is pleased with the support of American companies in developing the commercial and economic relations, he said: "Our joint efforts will mean more investment, more trade, and more employment for companies in both the United States and Türkiye."

Bolat also met with US Secretary of Commerce Howard Lutnick and "comprehensively" discussed the commercial and economic dimensions of the Türkiye-US strategic partnership. "We are fully committed to achieving the \$100 billion trade volume target set by the leaders of both countries. In this context, we will speed up our joint work," he said. Ankara believes that the two countries will strengthen the strategic partnership on "a much more solid foundation" based on mutual benefit, he added.

### Turkish Exports to Syria Surge to \$3B in 2025 With 54% Increase

**Exports to Syria jump 54% year-on-year as country sees political stabilization after Assad's ouster, says Turkish deputy trade minister**



Türkiye's exports to Syria rose 54.1% year-on-year to more than \$3 billion in 2025, driven by improving bilateral ties and political developments in Syria, Türkiye's deputy trade minister said. Özgür Volkan Ağar told the press that Turkish exports to Syria totaled \$1.95 billion last year, highlighting the sharp increase in shipments to the neighboring country.

Ağar said Türkiye's total goods exports reached \$270.6 billion in the January-November period. He said Türkiye continued to play a key role in exports to neighboring countries, noting that trade with Syria has expanded since the Assad regime was overthrown in December last year.

"We recorded an increase of over 54% versus previous years, so we can say that, as Syria develops further and strengthens its political stability, the relations between the two countries will be further developed, and we will achieve much better trade figures," Ağar added.

### Türkiye Secures \$587.3M from Asian Development Bank for Exporters Affected by 2023 Earthquakes

**Bank also approves \$150M, \$176.1M in additional financing for post-earthquake recovery, development, according to Treasury and Finance Ministry**




Türkiye has secured funding of €500 million (\$587.3 million) from the Asian Development Bank (ADB) for exporters affected by the February 2023 earthquakes in the country's southeast, according to the Treasury and Finance Ministry. Additionally, €150 million (\$176.1 million) and \$150 million in financing were also secured from the Asian Development Bank to be used by the Türkiye Development and Investment Bank for the post-earthquake recovery, renewable energy investments, and providing cost-effective capacity-enhancing resources.

### FAO Food Price Index Declines for the Third Consecutive Month in November, With All Indices But Cereals Down

The FAO Food Price Index\* (FFPI) averaged 125.1 points in November 2025, down 1.5 points (1.2 percent) from the revised October value of 126.6 points, marking a third consecutive monthly decline. Decreases in the price indices for dairy products, meat, sugar and vegetable oils outweighed an increase in the cereal index. Overall, the FFPI stood 2.6 points (2.1 percent) below its November 2024 level and remained 35.2 points (21.9 percent) lower than its peak in March 2022.



The FAO Cereal Price Index averaged 105.5 points in November, up 1.9 points (1.8 percent) from October but still 5.9 points (5.3 percent) below its level a year earlier. Despite a generally comfortable supply outlook and reports of good harvests in Argentina and Australia, global wheat prices rose by 2.5 percent in November, albeit from levels last seen in the first half of 2020. Wheat markets were bolstered by potential Chinese interest in supplies from the United States of America, concerns over continuing hostilities in the Black Sea region, and expectations of reduced plantings in the Russian Federation. International maize prices also rose in November, underpinned by firm demand for Brazilian supplies and reports of fieldwork being hampered by rains in Argentina and Brazil. World prices of barley and sorghum increased as well, with prices of all major grains influenced by higher soybean prices. By contrast, the FAO All Rice Price Index declined by 1.5 percent in November, as main-crop harvests in northern hemisphere exporting countries and subdued import demand kept Indica and fragrant rice quotations under downward pressure.

The FAO Vegetable Oil Price Index averaged 165.0 points in November, down 4.4 points (2.6 percent) from October and reaching a five-month low. The decline reflected lower prices of palm, rapeseed and sunflower oils, more than offsetting a slight increase in soybean oil quotations. International palm oil prices fell in November, resulting in a discount relative to competing oils, largely due to higher-than-expected production in Malaysia. Meanwhile, after several consecutive months of increases, rapeseed oil prices eased on positive global production prospects, while sunflower oil quotations declined amid seasonally increasing supplies from the Black Sea region. Global soybean oil prices remained steady and rose slightly, mainly supported by firm demand from the biodiesel sector, particularly in Brazil. Falling crude oil prices also contributed to lowering vegetable oil prices.

**The FAO Meat Price Index** averaged 124.6 points in November, down 1.0 point (0.8 percent) from its revised October value, while remaining 5.8 points (4.9 percent) above its level a year ago. The monthly decline continued to be driven by lower pig and poultry meat prices, while bovine meat quotations remained broadly stable and ovine meat prices increased. Poultry meat quotations fell as Brazil's export values declined amid abundant exportable supplies and stronger global competition. This drop was compounded by efforts to regain market share following the lifting of high pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI)-related trade bans by key importing countries, including China, which removed its restrictions in early November. Pig meat prices also eased, mainly due to lower quotations in the European Union amid ample supplies and subdued demand, particularly from China, after the introduction of import duties in early September. Meanwhile, the removal of tariffs on beef imports into the United States of America tempered the upward price pressure, especially on Australian products, as major exporters sought to maintain their competitiveness, leaving global bovine meat prices largely stable. By contrast, ovine meat prices increased, underpinned by solid global import demand.

**The FAO Dairy Price Index** averaged 137.5 points in November, down 4.4 points (3.1 percent) from October and 2.4 points (1.7 percent) from its value a year ago. International dairy prices fell for the fifth consecutive month, with declines recorded across all major dairy commodities. The continued easing stemmed from rising milk production and abundant export supplies in key producing regions, supported by ample butter and skim milk powder inventories in the European Union and seasonally higher output in New Zealand. Softer import demand for milk powders in parts of Asia also weighed on prices. Butter and whole milk powder registered the sharpest declines, driven by increased export availability and stronger competition among major suppliers, while skim milk powder prices fell only moderately amid ample supplies and limited buying interest. Cheese prices declined the least, as generally adequate supplies in both the European Union and Oceania were partially offset by firm demand in Asian and Near Eastern markets; even so, the cheese price index remained nearly 10 percent above its level a year earlier.

**The FAO Sugar Price Index** averaged 88.6 points in November, down 5.5 points (5.9 percent) from October and as much as 37.9 points (29.9 percent) from a year ago, marking its third consecutive monthly decline and its lowest level since December 2020 for the second month in a row. Expectations of ample global sugar supplies in the current season continued to exert downward pressure on prices. In Brazil's key southern growing regions, sugar production remained strong despite the seasonal slowdown in sugarcane crushing and lower use of sugarcane for sugar production. The good early season start to India's 2025/26 harvest and favourable crop prospects in Thailand further reinforced the positive global sugar supply outlook and added downward pressure on prices.

## Türkiye's Defense, Aviation Exports Exceed \$10B Threshold in 2025

Head of Defense Industries Secretariat says 2025 was a year of record-breaking figures for Türkiye



Turkish defense and aviation exports amounted to \$10.05 billion in 2025, up 48% year-on-year, the head of Türkiye's Defense Industries Secretariat said. Speaking at a ceremony disclosing foreign trade figures in Istanbul, Haluk Görgün told the press that 2026 was a year of record-breaking figures for Türkiye in terms of overall exports as well as in the defense industry.

He said the country continued to break records every month in 2025 compared to the previous year, adding that a historic record was achieved in December with defense and aviation exports exceeding \$2.5 billion. In 2025, defense and aviation exports in goods totaled \$9.87 billion while the figure was \$184 million in the services side. He said new defense contracts grew around 80% in 2025, recalling that the sector's exports were \$7.1 billion in 2024. "In terms of creating outstanding orders from the contracts signed, we completed 2024 with \$10 billion in new contracts, and 2025 with \$17.8 billion, which is a 78% growth," he said.

Görgün added that the increase in defense industry exports could be more clearly expressed by looking at its share in Türkiye's overall exports. "In 2022, we exported \$4.4 billion, and the share of defense and aviation exports in Türkiye's overall exports was 1.7%. "Today, the share of defense and aviation exports in Türkiye's overall exports has reached 3.7%." He further noted that the outcome was made possible by companies producing high-quality and cost-effective products, and providing after-sales support and assurance.

Görgün reminded that the country announced many new contracts and great successes with the public last year, saying: "We signed a military ship export contract with Portugal. Explaining that many UAV contracts were signed in the Gulf and Africa regions, along with ammunition contracts, he emphasized that the country closed 2025 with a new contract record of \$17.8 billion.

Görgün said the sector sees 2026 as a year in which deliveries will increase and new records will be broken. "Looking at the countries we mainly exported to last year, four of the top 10 countries are European and one is the US," he said. "Looking at the total ratio, approximately \$5.6 billion, or 56%, of the \$10 billion in exports went to the EU, NATO countries, and the US. Asia Pacific, the Middle East, and Africa followed."

## Türkiye Sets All-Time Record for Fish Production in 2025

**'Fish production in Türkiye reached 1.02 million tons in 2025, breaking an all-time record in the history of the Republic,' says Agriculture and Forestry Minister**



Türkiye's fish production reached a record 1.02 million tons in 2025, the highest level in the history of the Republic, said Agriculture and Forestry Minister İbrahim Yumaklı. Speaking to the press during a meeting with fishermen on the final day of 2025, Yumaklı said the quota system introduced under production planning had proven highly effective.

"Fish production in Türkiye reached 1.02 million tons in 2025, breaking an all-time record in the history of the Republic," he said. "This is truly a very large, massive figure." Highlighting the sector's contribution to the national economy, Yumaklı said fisheries exports had reached nearly \$2 billion, calling it a significant milestone for a country surrounded by seas on three sides. "Climate change has affected all sectors, including fisheries, through rising sea temperatures and changes in fish migration routes," he said. Yumaklı emphasized the importance of maintaining a balance between conservation and utilization, thanking fishermen and fish farmers for complying with sustainability rules.

## Türkiye Must Comply With Green Deal to Protect, Develop Exports: Trade Minister

**Türkiye believes in requirements of green economy, Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat tells 2nd International Environmental Communications Summit**



Türkiye has decided to implement and abide by the EU Green Deal, which aims to transform Europe's economy, energy, and industry into a more sustainable future, the country's trade minister said. "We must comply with this agreement both to maintain our competitiveness and to protect and develop our export markets," Bolat said at the 2nd International Environmental Communications Summit, held by the International Environmental Communications Association in the capital Ankara.

He said environmental performance is no longer merely a matter of sustainability, but a key determinant of direct competitiveness. Telling how the EU launched a comprehensive and strategic transformation process with the EU Green Deal, he stressed: "Because we have a Customs Union with the EU and do about 40% of our trade with the EU, we have decided to implement the EU Green Deal the same way." "Our government is doing this because we believe in the requirements of a green economy," he said.

Stressing that Türkiye will host next year's COP31 UN climate change conference, Bolat said the world is undergoing a transformation that is redefining all areas of the economy, from production and consumption to trade and investments. Bolat said one of the most important processes of the agreement is the Border Carbon Adjustment Mechanism, and that Türkiye is working on complying

with its rules. The mechanism currently covers the iron and steel, aluminum, fertilizer, electricity, hydrogen, and cement sectors, he said, adding that Türkiye has approximately \$23 billion in exports in these sectors.

Bolat said iron, steel, and aluminum constitute the main inputs for many industrial sectors, explaining: "The resulting administrative and financial costs are significant issues that could directly impact our competitiveness in foreign trade and the functioning of the Customs Union." He said one of the key elements of the deal is the transition to a circular economy, noting that new practices such as the introduction of product-based legislation across all product groups and the "digital product passport" for EU market entry have become a part of life.

### **Zero Waste Foundation Prepares Framework Document for COP31 Ahead of Türkiye's Hosting**

**Zero Waste Foundation, under honorary presidency of Turkish first lady Emine Erdoğan, developed framework document to ensure sustainable COP31, which Türkiye will chair, host in 2026**



An Istanbul-based environmental foundation headed by Turkish first lady Emine Erdoğan as its honorary president has prepared a framework document for the 31st UN Climate Change Conference (COP31) in 2026, which Türkiye will chair and host. The document by the Zero Waste Foundation aims to reduce the carbon emissions, optimize resource use, and make environmental performance measurable for all stakeholders.

The Sustainable COP31 Framework offers an internationally aligned roadmap, covering zero-waste management protocols, carbon-reduction and offsetting strategies, sustainable logistics and transport planning, environmental standards for venues, and mechanisms for stakeholder engagement and transparency. The Zero Waste Foundation is building a multi-stakeholder preparation ecosystem across Türkiye, emphasizing that preparations for COP31 should not be limited to technical infrastructure alone.

While conducting policy development work with universities and research centers, it also engages with local administrations on sustainable city practices and exchanging views with businesses on production models, accelerating the private sector's low-carbon transition, and raising social awareness.

In a statement, Zero Waste Foundation President Samed Ağırbaş said the zero-waste vision is now recognized not only as an environmental policy, but as a concrete, measurable, and applicable global solution model in the fight against climate change. Ağırbaş said COP31 presents a historic opportunity to convey this approach to the international community in a more powerful way.

At the UN General Assembly in December 2022, the "Zero Waste" resolution — led by Türkiye and co-sponsored by 105 countries — was adopted by vote, proclaiming March 30 as the International Day of Zero Waste. First lady Erdoğan delivered the keynote address at the first observance of the International Day of Zero Waste, held at the UN General Assembly Hall on March 30, 2023. During the event, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres announced the establishment of the "Advisory Board of Eminent Persons on Zero Waste" and offered the role of chair to the Turkish first lady. Erdoğan also

led an event titled “Towards a Global Zero Waste Movement,” at the Turkish House (Turkevi) in New York City as part of the 78th UN General Assembly that year. At the event, President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan became the first signatory of the Global Zero Waste Goodwill Declaration.

The Conference of the Parties (COP) is the supreme decision-making body of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), meeting annually since 1995 to assess progress and negotiate action on climate change. The 31st session (COP31) is scheduled to take place in Türkiye from Nov. 9-20, 2026, primarily in Antalya, with the Leaders’ Summit to be held in İstanbul. Nearly 200 countries are expected to meet in Türkiye to discuss the next phase of Paris Agreement implementation, including new and updated emission-reduction targets, adaptation measures, climate finance, and the implementation of carbon-market rules.

Previous COPs have been hosted by Germany, Japan, Denmark, France, the UK, Egypt, the United Arab Emirates, Azerbaijan, and Brazil. Türkiye, which has earned international recognition for its mediation efforts in recent global crises, is applying this diplomatic experience to climate diplomacy through COP31.

**Green Organized Industrial Zone Certificate strengthens both environmental compliance and international competitiveness**



Türkiye’s green industrial transformation is gaining momentum. The number of Organized Industrial Zones (OSBs) that have received the Green OSB Certificate from the Turkish Standards Institution (TSE) has reached 27. Driven by global green industry demand and especially the European Union’s Green Deal and Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM), Turkish manufacturers are rapidly shifting to low-carbon production.

The Green OSB Certificate strengthens both environmental compliance and international competitiveness through energy efficiency, renewable energy use, wastewater management and sustainable infrastructure. Türkiye continues to lead the green transformation in its organized industrial zones. While the country now has a nationwide network of 27 certified Green OSBs, the EU does not have a centralized “Green Organized Industrial Zones” certification scheme. Sustainable industrial zones there remain national-level, voluntary pilot projects.
